Architectural Committee

While the long awaited rains were an overdue relief, they also fueled the unsightly weeds that can be seen thriving throughout our neighborhood. That being said, the Architectural Committee (AC) will focus on the following while doing their inspections: Weeds! Weeds growing where lawns once occupied space; weeds in rock beds and mulch; weeds emerging through driveways, bricks and pavers; weeds peering through shrubs, bushes and ivy; weeds insisting on sharing flowerbed space; weeds nestling on property lines, retaining walls and fences; and weeds just simply popping up wherever they please.

Aside from noting the unsightly weeds taking over the association, AC members will also note: tree branches blocking street lights, street signs, and hanging lower than 8 feet from the sidewalk and 12 feet above the street. Also, bushes, shrubs and ivy that are blocking sidewalk access or view and all painted exterior surfaces such as base, trim, fascia boards, balconies, garage doors and beams.

Homeowners NEED to submit an Architectural Application prior to commencing any landscaping or renovation in front of their lot or any area that can be seen from common areas, sidewalk or street. And wait for either an approval, approval with conditions or denial. Please note a denial could be that more information is reguested. This includes but not limited to removing trees, painting house, replacing driveways, replacing front lawns and/or fences, and replacing windows. WEST POOL UPDATE

The West Pool project is well under way. The old gunite coating (plaster) has been jackhammered out, the concrete deck has been removed, all of the rusted-out metal electrical conduit that was under the deck has been taken out as well as all of the plumbing. 2 inch PVC pipe has been replaced with massive 6 inch PVC and the pump will be upgraded to 5HP. All of the drainage has been replaced and everything brought up to modern codes. By the time you read this they may well be laying the new pavers for the deck. After that the pool will be replastered (gunite), with lane markings and new coping. Please plan to join us for the grand reopening BBQ on a date TBD, close to Memorial Day.

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

What a difference an interest rate makes!

Fed Chair Janet Yellen's speech on Tuesday was by far the biggest event this week. Her message was well received by investors, and both stocks and bonds improved after her speech. Recent economic data had little impact, and mortgage rates ended the week lower.

The Fed statement from the March 16 Fed meeting presented a very gradual approach to tightening monetary policy. Over the last couple of weeks, however, several Fed officials have made the case for tightening monetary policy at a more rapid pace. On Tuesday, Yellen discussed the reasons to proceed cautiously with federal funds rate hikes. For one, economic troubles in other countries could slow the U.S. economy. According to Yellen, the Fed's outlook for global economic growth is now "slightly weaker" than it was just three months ago. In addition, she expressed concern that the increase in core inflation in recent months could be due to temporary factors. She described other indicators which suggest that inflation could decline in coming months.

What does this mean for local home buyers and sellers? This could signal a slow increase in mortgage rates over the next year...given various factors in the global economy.

And how will that impact our sales market?

Check the chart below...

If a home buyer wanted to buy a new home and keep

their monthly mortgage amount around \$3,200/mo. - note the decrease in purchasing buyer as mortgage rates increase. If you wanted to buy a \$700k house in this area, and interest rates rise over the next year or so...your buying power goes down. That could mean the difference between living in the 94521 zip code or the 94518 zip code, which has different schools, lower values and less amenities as an example.

This may feel like an extreme example in that mortgage rates may gradually increase over time, however I thought it was a powerful visual on how much the impact may be for buyers looking to wait to purchase a home. *Until next time... Nancy*



Tips for Homebuyers in a Hot Seller's Market

This may be a really good time to be in the housing market – if you are a seller, that is. There just aren't enough homes on the market, so if you are selling right now, you may find yourself in a more favorable position. Multiple offers and bids over list price for some properties aren't unusual these days.
