SAFETY & SECURITY TOWN HALL

Sunday, October 16, 2-4 pm in the Business Office

At our last Town Hall in August, the majority of the questions and comments from Homeowners in attendance revolved around safety and security issues. As a result, the Board has called for a special Town Hall that will focus on these issues. An officer with GSG Security will be on hand to explain their procedures, listen to your concerns and answer any questions. We'll have examples of situations where you should call GSG and other situations where you should call Concord PD. And we'll have results of the Safety and Security Survey, as noted above. Please try to make this important meeting.

ANNUAL MEETING HAS BEEN POSTPONED UNTIL OCTOBER 27

Due to the lack of a quorum of ballots, the Annual Membership Meeting on September 22 could not be held and has been rescheduled, with a lower quorum requirement, for Thursday, October 27, at 7pm in the Business Office. At that time, the ballots will be opened.

It is very important that you return your ballots prior to the October 27 Meeting, as this is an election not only for the Board of Directors, but for the adoption of revised Bylaws. If the Bylaws pass, among other things we will not have to reschedule the Annual Meeting in the years to come, as the initial quorum requirement will then be 25%, instead of the 50% that it is now.

Ballots can be mailed to Collins Management or dropped in the Business Office mail slot and must be received by October 26. And please remember to sign the outer envelope.

Tip to Improve your Exterior House Lighting During the Night Time

Daylight Savings Time ends on Sunday, November 6th. Here is something you can do to supplement the poor uneven street lighting provided by the City of Concord.

Use your existing driveway and front porch wall-mounted light fixtures to automatically turn on in the evening and go off in the morning. This costs very little to purchase and to operate all night.

A dusk-to-dawn lighting control device (available at hardware stores) screws into the light fixture socket in place of the existing bulb. Then install an 8 to 10 watt LED bulb into the dusk-to-dawn control device.

Make sure you have the clearance in the fixture for both the dusk-to-dawn control device and the LED bulb. This also can give the appearance that someone is home, or at the very least have the lights on for you when you arrive home.

Tired of cars speeding through our neighborhood every morning?

With school back in session I am sure you have seen the increased traffic through our neighborhood on South and North Larwin. While cutting through our neighborhood is not illegal, speeding, illegal passing, and other traffic violations endangering residents are! Although the Safety and Security Committee continues to work with the city on various issues, YOU, as taxpayers, have the power to submit complaints to the city and Police Dept about traffic and other issues we experience. There are many ways to do so Call them at 925-671-3200, or you can Email fieldoperations@cityofconcord.org or cpd@cityofconcord. org. You can also contact them on Social Media such as Facebook and Twitter. Additionally. another convenient way to contact the city is to download the "Concord Connect" free mobile app. Again, you have rights and the power to make a positive impact on keeping our neighborhood safe and secure.
