### PICK UP YOUR GATE FOBS NOW!

Our new electronic gate entry system is up and running! All 4 pool gates and 3 of the 6 tennis gates (the 2 gates on the Greenbelt side of the upper courts and the Smoke Tree gate on the lower courts) can now be opened with either your current keys or the new fobs. (Of course, fobs and keys will only work when the pools are open for use.) On April 2, all ten of the pool and tennis court locks will be rekeyed and so the keys you now have will no longer work. Please don't wait until then. You can pick up your 2 free fobs (per household) any time the Clubhouse is open - noon to 8, M-S and noon to 6 on Sunday. Please be sure to bring your CHOA badge and picture ID showing that you live here. Tenants will need to pay a \$300 deposit, unless you have already done so for your pool key. And keep that pool key - you will still need it for the dog park.

### President's Corner - March 2018

Fellow Residents,

This past Sunday the HOA held a "thank you" gathering at the clubhouse for the ongoing volunteers during 2017. This event was catered by the Mecca Restaurant and was attended by approximately 100 guests. These volunteers donated their time on our various committees, board of directors, and the monthly distribution of the Signal. Without the time and commitment from our resident volunteers, our association would not appear so beautiful or run as smoothly as it does. The committee volunteers, whether it's Architecture, Safety & Security, Landscape or Activities, all spend time meeting monthly to ensure our community maintains the high standards we have come to expect living in the Crossings. Our tireless block distributers and area reps of your newsletter make sure to get you the Signal rain or shine! A huge thank you to all volunteers for everything you do for our community. Openings you ask? If any members wish to join a committee or volunteer in some capacity, please contact out General Manager Pat Magee and he will let you know what openings we have.

We are now two weeks into the key fob distribution to replace the old style metal keys. If you have not switched over to the fob yet, you can do it quickly and easily at the clubhouses during regular hours. All you need is your photo identification and you're done!

Court parking issues need to be addressed as we have increasingly noticed cars parking 'head in' at the end of the courts. This is particularly an issue at the courts nearest the center of the greenbelt. It is a Concord vehicle ordinance that vehicles are to park adjacent to the curb with the right side (passenger) wheels within 18 inches from the curb. This is also an issue because emergency vehicles and service trucks cannot turn around when vehicles are parked illegally.

Major improvements and upgrades to the east pool are coming along on schedule. All below ground plumbing and electrical is completed. Pool plastering and pavers are next up and weather permitting should take place in the coming weeks.

Upcoming events at the Crossings! Mark your calendars for the Sound the Alarm fire prevention safety seminar on March 18th and the annual Spring Festival on March 31st. Signups via Evite are going out soon so be sure to RSVP. If you don't have access to the email invite, contact the clubhouse and we'll reserve for you.

Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms and outside sleeping areas.

Test smoke alarms every month.

Talk with all family members about a fire escape plan and practice the plan twice a year.

If a fire occurs in your home, GET OUT, STAY OUT and CALL FOR HELP.
