<u>Tips for Protecting Your Home From Fire</u> Hazards

The wildfires continue to be a major concern for communities in California. The recent Camp Fire in Paradise and surrounding areas is a constant reminder of what could happen to any community. While there are many ways a fire can start, there are a few ways to help prevent or minimize how quickly it can spread. Homeowners can help protect their property by doing simple routine "chores" around the home including:

- Keep debris and leaves from piling up on the ground and roof
- Clear weeds and keep tall native grasses trimmed low to the ground
- Keep tree branches trimmed 10 feet from the ground
- Keep gutters clear of leaves and debris
- Replace dead/dying landscape with drought tolerant fire resistant species
- If burning wood or fake logs in fireplace, have a spark arrestor on chimney
- Avoid storing firewood and lumber near the home; 30 feet away is recommended.

When updating your home consider using noncombustible materials for roofs, decks and gutters. Hardscape materials like concrete, pavers, stone or gravel are safer than combustible materials. The choices you make could be the difference in your home being saved in a catastrophic wildfire.

Reward

The Board of Directors is prepared to pay up to \$2,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of anyone who willfully destroys or damages association property, including graffiti. Over 70% of injuries sustained during the holidays result from accidents while setting up decorations. Please take your time and be safe putting up any and all holiday decorations this season. Below are some safety tips to look over before starting to make sure you're having a safe and secure holiday:

- Check for damages on both cords and wiring
- Test strands of lights for burnt out bulbs before installation
- Ensure any outdoor lighting is UL-rated
- Be sure you have sure footing before climbing any ladders
- Ensure that your lights and decorations are stored properly

Please remember that all holiday decorations must be removed by the end of January.

Contacting First Security vs Concord Police Department

When something happens in the neighborhood it can be confusing to figure out who to call between the security company and the Concord Police. Since CHOA is a mixture of public streets, and private land it's important to call the right people to ensure the correct response is taken. Below are some guidelines to help figure out who to call:

 Suspicious individuals in the common areas such as the greenbelt, pool areas, Clubhouse, tennis/ basketball courts and dog park.

- Suspicious individuals on your property, in the courts and on North and South Larwin.
- Theft or damage to your property or any type of altercation.

If at any time you are threatened by anybody on either the common areas or the streets, and feel there is an immediate danger to yourself, others or your property always call 911!

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


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
