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PROBLEMS WITH AUTOMATIC PAY FOR HOMEOWNER DUES

If you have your monthly homeowner dues paid automatically through a banking or credit institution there is a chance your December payment was either declined or refunded to you. This was due to an error on Union Bank's side and is simple to resolve. If your payment was rejected or returned, you will still need to submit payment for the month of December.

If you use Union Bank's payment system, please be aware that payments scheduled for December and beyond will not be processed unless you signed up with the bank's new system. If you want to use Union Bank's system, the company has offered the following instructions:

1. Go to hoabankers.com

2. Enter your login ID and password

3. Go to the Payees tab and select Edit Automatic Payments and Alerts

4. Cancel recurring payments by selecting the Cancel button

Next, re-register to set up future recurring payments:

- 1. Go to HOAbankservices.com
- 2. Select Online Payments for Homeowners

3. Click Sign-In or Register to make one-time or recurring eCheck payments

If you use a different company to pay your monthly dues and your payment did not go through, please contact your financial institution to have your December payment reauthorized and resent. As we enter the new year, we can take pause over the many 2018 accomplishments and activities of another successful year in Walnut Country – The Crossings.

After a year of well-attended and fun activities including our Wine Tasting, Spring Festival/Safety Fair, the new "Concert on the Belt", Back-to-School Fall and Winter Holiday Celebration, we closed out with our last community event of the year - our **second Crossing New Year's Eve Party**. Looking back at 2018, we had a change in our association's management. Pat Magee retired and we brought in Rhiannon Harris as our new General Manager and hired Stephen Sulyma as her full-time assistant and Clubhouse Supervisor. Rhi brought her industry expertise while Stephen brought his knowledge of several years working in for us.

We also continued to manage and improve our property with our committees and projects during 2018 including:

- Coming in close to budget and developing our 2019 budget to keep our monthly dues level at \$97/ month. This included a comprehensive review of our liability and insurance needs to reduce risk to all homeowners as well as our reserves to insure we have planned well for the future.
- Our Landscape committee had a great year with the completion of the South Slope pilot project and beginning the final stages of our main greenbelt irrigation upgrades.
- Our Architectural Committee which has undergone change in both leadership and committee makeup and continues to refine processes and increase training.
- Our Safety and Security committee has brought great information to our homeowners in helping them be safe and secure with their most recent effort being our Wildfire Seminar in October.
- Our Board of Directors welcomed two new members. Marc Buchanan returned to the Board and Dave Stelter has joined as a new member bringing us to full strength with 7 members.
- Facility improvements including:
 - ° Completion of the East Pool renovation to make it look great and last long into the future.
 - Completion of our new security fob program providing better control over our pools and tennis facilities.
 - ° Completion of renovations for the Tennis Backboard area by the lower tennis courts.
 - ° Completion of emergency renovations to address issues at the Walnut Country Preschool

We'll keep you abreast of our plans and activities in the coming year. We are working to bring the Board together for a planning session in January where we will work to establish our working norms and plans for 2019. We also invite you to join us this year for one of the monthly Board of Directors' meetings. It's a great way to stay informed and involved. On that note, please join us on January 24th for our next regular monthly BOD meeting.

TIPS FOR PREVENTING PACKAGE THEFT

In the last month, several residents have had delivered packages stolen from their doorsteps, and mail stolen from their mailboxes. If you see a suspected theft in progress, call Concord Police dispatch at (925)671.-3333. If your package was stolen, please fill out a police report online. The police need to know there is a problem at the Crossings so that they devote more time to patrolling here.

Remember, CHOA's security company is not responsible for activity on Concord city streets where packages are delivered; the security company only patrols CHOA's shared facilities and grounds. Also, the Business Office will not hold packages of any kind for residents.

Some tips to ensure your package is secured

Have the package delivered to work, a friend, a neighbor, or a local carrier store. Try using different delivery options during the high-crime season. Have packages delivered where someone can accept them such as work or by a neighbor, or require a signature for delivery. Also, consider using the carrier's local store for a delivery address and picking it up there.

Signup for the USPS scanned email program called Informed Delivery. The USPS will scan letters being delivered to your mail each day and send an email to you with their images. This service is free and available at: <u>https://informeddelivery.usps.com/box/</u> <u>pages/intro/start.action</u>

Leave a note. Delivery drivers may honor requests to place packages behind a gate, shrub, or other location; residents should contact their carrier. In some cases, a note on the door is enough.

Track packages. Package tracking has come a long way with online features. Setup alerts to your phone or email so you know when the package is en route. You will know when it is at your door to pick it up yourself or ask a neighbor to grab it.

Amazon locker. If you purchase items from Amazon, consider having it delivered to an Amazon Locker located in a local Safeway or Whole Foods. When it's there, you'll receive a code to open the secure locker and pickup your item.

<u>Reward</u>

The Board of Directors is prepared to pay up to \$2,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of anyone who willfully destroys or damages association property, including graffiti. Conditions apply including:


- Serving alcohol requires hiring and paying for a security officer.


