Sidewalk Repair & Maintenance

Did you know the sidewalk (including curb & gutter) are the responsibility of the homeowner in the city of Concord? As our community ages, many sections of the sidewalk have begun to show deterioration, cracking, and or lifting. When these issues become significant enough it can present safety issues for people walking. We recently had a tripping accident due to a lifted portion of the sidewalk.

The good news is that while the local municipal code clearly states the repair and maintenance is the responsibility of the homeowner as well as any potential liability, the City of Concord has approved a program that will assist homeowners in the repair process. By utilizing the City's authorized sidewalk repair contractors, the City will waive permit and inspection fees. This is a savings in excess of \$1500.

The newly established policy on Sidewalk Inspection and Repair also provides for "temporary fixes" to immediately minimize dangerous hazard, but does not eliminate the responsibility of the homeowner. If complaints are made that require Concord to initiate repairs, homeowners will be notified and will bear the full cost of repairs. Now is a good time to review your trees and surrounding landscape which are often the cause of sidewalk failures.

You can review the entire policy and the details by visiting the Concord website. A copy of the ordinance is available in the Walnut Country business office.

Hiring Lifeguards and Swim Instructors For Summer 2019

If you're interested in becoming one of our CHOA Lifeguards or swim instructors this summer, please download an application from our website, or pick one up at the Clubhouse. Applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Must be at least 16 years old
- Must be able to swim 300 yards continuously
- Must have completed and provide proof of Lifeguard/CPR/AED certification (A list of classes can be found at www.bappoa.org/lifeguard-trainings or www.redcross.org/take-a-class/lifeguarding)
- Must obtain a work permit if under 18 years old (Work permits can be picked up from your school or downloaded online from www.dir.ca.gov/dlse/dlseformb1-1.pdf)

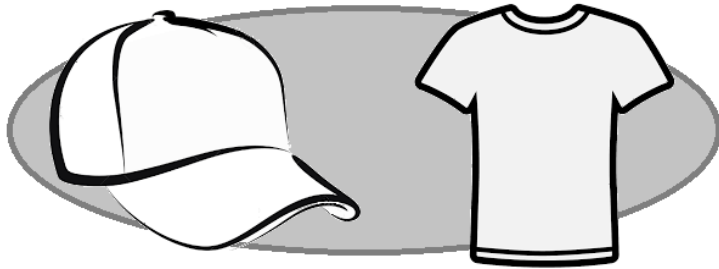
