


### Side Pools Opening and More

### Dogs off leash on the Greenbelt

A frequent complaint from homeowners continues to be concerns about dogs "running wild" on the greenbelt scaring children, adults and smaller dogs. As a reminder, there is a leash law in Contra Costa County and it is strictly enforced in our community. Please be considerate when enjoying our common areas and follow the laws. While most dogs are very friendly and present no harm, some can be very intimidating and can react differently when off leash. Dog owners can be held responsible for any issues or damages that may occur if caused by your pet.

Below is the County ordinance.

Your dog must be on a leash and under your control unless s/he is on your property, the property of a consenting adult, or on property such as a dog park where the off-leash conditions are designated by appropriate signage or regulation (s). Contra Costa County enforces a "leash law," which forbids dogs from being at large or "loose" (with certain exemptions). County Code Animal Ordinance, Division 416-4.402

Please be considerate and follow the rules for everyone's Safety and Security.



### Reward

### **Dry Rot and You**

You gaze up at their simple beauty every day, yet never actually see what's rotten lurking right before your eyes: dry rot and water damage! The architecture of mid-century modern makes it easy for your home's exterior horizontal beams to get exposed to the elements. The beams project out to or beyond the roof-edge framing, and their degree of vulnerability depends on the home's orientation to the sun and its amount of exposure to rough weather, and how well the beams are maintained. Please be sure to check on the status of exposed beams at least annually, and paint over any exposed areas, or call in an expert when beams start to rot.

- Must be able to swim 300 yards continuously

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


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
